8:00- Workshop 1: Mobility On Demand On-Ramp Workshop 5:00 PM (Invitation Only)

State

Transit agencies are integrating new mobility options to better serve public transportation needs. The Mobility On Demand On-Ramp Program explores challenges and opportunities to achieve that goal through a variety of mobility on demand projects. In this workshop, transportation agencies and innovators interested in developing mobility on demand will interact with national leaders to discuss: developing business plans; establishing successful partnerships; creating mobility performance metrics; and designing strategies for community engagement. Participants will also learn about the six Mobility On Demand On-Ramp Program participant agencies' projects. In learning about peer agencies' experiences, workshop participants will gain tools for designing their own mobility on demand pilot projects.

8:00- Workshop 2: Public Agencies Evolving into Mobility 12:00 PM Integrators (Invitation Only)

With the changing mobility landscape enabled by technology and changing customer desires, public agencies must evolve alongside the new mobility mix to further the mission of equitable sustainable mobility. Customers want to look, book, and pay for their transportation trips with a tap on the phone. If information about bikeshare, carshare, ridehail, bus, and rail are all

instantly available with that tap, customers will enjoy a wealth of choices. This discussion among a core group of leaders from the public, NGO, and private sectors will discuss the pathways and barriers for agencies to navigate this change.

This workshop will prepare practitioners to utilize micromobility and ridehailing data in decisions around street design, curb management, and regulatory enforcement. As the third-busiest railroad terminal in the United States, Chicago's Union Station serves over 300 trains per weekday, which together carry roughly 120,000 arriving and departing passengers. Participants will get an exclusive, behind-the-scenes tour of recent improvements and proposed infrastructure projects as part of the Union Station Master Plan--a collaborative effort between Amtrak, the Chicago Department of Transportation, Metra, and the Regional Transportation Authority. Attendees will learn how the Master Development – another ongoing Amtrak initiative – also affects Union Station.



Sharon Feigon
Founder and Executive Director
Shared-Use Mobility Center

Sharon is a founder and the executive director of the Shared-Use Mobility Center, a non-profit public-interest organization working to foster collaboration in shared mobility and help connect the growing industry with transit agencies, cities and communities across the nation. As executive director, Sharon leads SUMC's work, which includes conducting innovative research around the impacts of shared mobility, developing pilot projects to test shared mobility strategies, and providing advice and technical assistance to cities and regions in order to help extend the benefits of shared mobility for all. SUMC was also awarded a contract to develop the Innovation Knowledge Accelerator in partnership with the Federal Transit Administration to assist cities undertaking Mobility on Demand projects.

Sharon was previously the CEO of IGO Carsharing, the nonprofit organization that started carsharing in the Chicago region. Under Sharon's leadership, IGO grew from a small pilot project into a successful operating company with 15,000 members in 45 neighborhoods. Sharon worked with the Chicago Transit Authority to create the only combined car-share/transit fare card in North America, led IGO's expansion into underserved communities, and also developed solar canopies and charging stations that helped introduce renewable charging and mobility hubs to the region.

Prior to taking the helm at IGO, Sharon was the Director of Research & Development at the Center for Neighborhood Technology for more than a decade, where she the Principal Investigator and Lead Author for key reports and coordinated CNT's Transit-Oriented Development Program. Prior to this, Sharon was a founder of the national Carsharing Association and has served as Co-Chair of the Transportation Research Board's Shared Vehicle Committee and as a member of the U.S. Green Building Council's LEED-ND Committee, which created LEED standards for neighborhood developments.



Anthony FoxxChief Policy Officer and Senior Advisor to the President and CEO Lyft

In his role, Anthony works alongside Lyft's co-founders and executive team -- at the intersection of transportation policy, technology, and public-private partnerships -- to expand affordable mobility options and improve people's lives with the world's best transportation.

From 2013-2017, Anthony served as the 17th United States Secretary of Transportation, leading an agency with more than 55,000 employees and a \$70 billion budget, whose primary goal was to ensure that America maintains the safest, most efficient transportation system in the world. Among many accomplishments during his tenure, the DOT established a first-ever policy framework for the safe integration of self-driving vehicles, and leveraged \$350 million in public and private funding to demonstrate how smart technology can change cities and local communities.

Anthony was also the mayor of Charlotte, North Carolina from 2009-2013. During this time, he made transportation investments the centerpiece of Charlotte's job creation and economic recovery efforts. These investments included extending the LYNX light rail system, the largest capital project ever undertaken by the city. He also expanded Charlotte-Douglas International Airport (the sixth busiest in the world), worked with North Carolina Governor Beverly Perdue to accelerate the I-485 outer belt loop, and started the Charlotte Streetcar project.

Shelley Poticha is the managing director of Healthy People & Thriving Communities, one of the four cornerstone programs at the Natural Resources Defense Council, a leading nonprofit group that uses policy, science, the law, finance, and public engagement to change systems, build agencies, and secure more equitable and sustainable access to resources so that all can thrive. In addition, Shelley is a longtime partner in multiple NRDC initiatives including transportation policy reform, LEED-ND, and the creation of Smart Growth America.

Prior to joining NRDC, Shelley was a senior adviser and director of the Office of Sustainable Housing and Communities at the Department of Housing and Urban Development. Before joining HUD, she served as President and CEO of Reconnecting America, where she became a national leader for the reform of land use and transportation planning and policy with the goal of creating more sustainable and equitable development, particularly around transit stations. She also previously served as Executive Director of the Congress for the New Urbanism.
